FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, The Tribal Council, by Resolution No. 86-14, directed that the proposed amendment to the Liquor Ordinance No. 125, be posted for a period of ten (10) days as required by the Tribal Constitution; and

WHEREAS, said proposed amendment has been posted for more than ten (10) days and the Tribal Council has not received any public comments opposing said amendment; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concluded that said amendment should be finally passed for the benefit of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby enacts the attached amendment to Ordinance No. 125, known as the Liquor Ordinance.

The foregoing resolution was on April 16, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (q,s,t,u) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)

ORDINANCE OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT ENACTED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe regularly assembled on the 16th day of April, 1986 that the White Mountain Apache Liquor Ordinance, Ordinance No. 125, is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION II  
DEFINITIONS

(bb) Public Modern Dance as used in this Ordinance shall be any public gathering, dance, party, or other social event held for any purpose other than a traditional tribal ceremony.

SECTION X  
ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES

(a) Violations.

24. Public Modern Dances - All public modern dances are hereby imposed with a curfew of 1:00 a.m. It shall be a violation of this Ordinance for any person to sponsor, participate in any public modern dance past the hour of 1:00 a.m.

(a) Any sponsor of a public modern dance shall be responsible for clean-up of the public area. Failure of any sponsor to clean-up any public area where a public modern dance is held shall be a violation of this Ordinance and said said sponsor shall be subject to civil liability for the costs of clean-up.

SECTION XI  
TRIBAL COURT JURISDICTION  
ENFORCEMENT

(f) Criminal Penalties. Any person subject to tribal criminal jurisdiction and prosecution and adjudged to be in violation of this Ordinance may be subject to a criminal penalty of up to 180 days imprisonment and/or a maximum fine of \$500.00.
