

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised by the Bureau of Indian Affairs regarding the base amounts available for certain Bureau of Indian Affairs functions contracted by the Tribe under various P. L. 638 programs; and


WHEREAS, a discussion of the 638 contracts for the Tribal Police Department e.g., Law Enforcement Services, Tribal Court and Tribal Social Services expanded into a general discussion of all 638 contracts presently being performed for the tribe as well as the feasibility of continuing the same; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the tribal 638 contracts should be reviewed, evaluated, and assessed to determine the feasibility of continuing the same in terms of efficiency and costs to the Tribe and, further whether or not said contracts should be retroceded to the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the office of the Tribal Chairman request in writing from the Bureau of Indian Affairs an evaluation of all existing 638 contracts presently administered by the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on May 8, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1, (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
