

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has responsibility for the welfare of its membership and part of that responsibility includes increasing employment opportunities for its tribal members; and

WHEREAS, the Indian population in the Seattle-King County area is in need of social services, especially education and training for employment; and


WHEREAS, education and training for employment is a critical element in enabling Indians to escape from the vicious cycle of unemployment, poverty and attendant problems; and

WHEREAS, the Seattle Indian Center has provided a wide range of social services for the Seattle-King County Indian Community; and

WHEREAS, the Seattle Indian Center's education programs have been effective in enabling Indians to earn their GED, obtain skills, gain employment and to further their training opportunities and education.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby endorses and authorizes the Seattle Indian Center's Education Department to provide vocational training to members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe residing in the Seattle area who apply for participation in their vocational training programs.

The foregoing resolution was on May 13, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 11 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
