

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, tribal member, Tenny Gatewood, a former employee and manager of the Apache Service Station in Whiteriver has come before the Tribal Council and requested Council assistance to re-investigate what he states were false charges made against him four years ago which resulted in his dismissal and ruination of his reputation; and

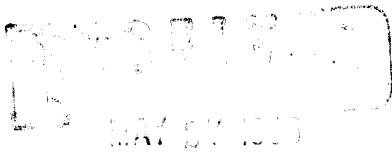
WHEREAS, Mr. Gatewood further explains to the Council, that for the last four years, he has suffered ill-health and long periods of unemployment as direct result of false charges made by the former Manager of Apache Enterprise, Ken Hart, acting in concert with other employees who manufactured charges against him and which he was unable to challenge effectively; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Gatewood requests that the Tribal Council review his personnel file as well as the Grievance Committee record so that the wrongfulness of his dismissal can be brought to light and his name cleared so that he can again rejoin the employment force.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Attorney and Tribal Chairman to assist Mr. Gatewood by reviewing his personnel file and the Grievance Hearing record to determine whether or not Mr. Gatewood was injured as a result of any wrong doing or false charges by prior Apache Enterprise management.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs the Personnel Department to cooperate fully with the Office of the Tribal Chairman and Tribal Attorney by releasing any and all information to said offices pertaining to Mr. Tenny Gatewood's personnel file and the Grievance Hearing as Mr. Gatewood has publically given consent to the foregoing release of any information pertaining to his personnel file and Grievance Hearing to Chairman Reno Johnson and the Tribal Attorney.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that in the event the investigation and review of Mr. Gatewood case indicates that he suffered injury as a result of false accusations made by the former Manager of Apache Enterprise, then it shall be the obligation and responsibility of Apache Enterprise to place Mr. Gatewood in a suitable employment position.
