


RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Tribal Member, Erma Platt, has reported to the Tribal Council that the Bureau of Indian Affairs Land Operations Division re-routed a ditch near her farmland in upper East Fork and by doing so damaged her farmland which to date has not been repaired by the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and


WHEREAS, Tribal Council concludes that the Fort Apache Indian Agency is responsible for the damage and should repair said damage as soon as possible.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs Land Operation Department immediately repair the damage to Erma Platt's farmland and that the Superintendent report back to the Tribal Council the date said repairs were made and completed to her satisfaction.

The foregoing resolution was on May 14, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
