

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, tribal member, Mrs. Lyda Chino, has come before the Tribal Council and requested an explanation as to why she has been directed to halt the fencing of her property in Canyon Day which she states is hers by inheritance and as a result of documentation authorized from the former Chairman of Land Board, Mr. Raymus Albert; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that both sides to the land dispute should be heard by the Land Board and that Mr. Raymus Albert should be present in order to disclose what information he has in reference to Mrs. Chino's claim and that all parties and witnesses for each party should be present at the land board meeting so that this dispute can be resolved amicably.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby tables the complaint made by Mrs. Lyda Chino as well as the subject matter of the land dispute until such time as the Land Board has met with all of the parties and witnesses in respect to said land dispute and has had the opportunity to resolve the matter.

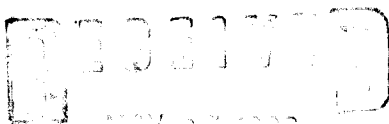
