WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service has entered into three Memorandums of Agreements (Project Numbers PH 83-547, 83-465, 83-408) with the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and the White Mountain Apache Utility Authority in furtherance of a project for the installation and/or improvement of domestic water supply and sewage disposal facilities, attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein; and


WHEREAS, such services have been completed by the Indian Health Service, and are being transferred to the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby declares its intent to enter into Transfer Agreements accepting transfer of the aforementioned sanitation facilities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Chairman and in his absence the Vice Chairman is hereby authorized to sign each Transfer Agreement approved by the Tribal Council herein.

The foregoing resolution was on July 10, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)

WHEREAS, the United States of America, acting through the Indian Health Service, Department of Health and Human Services, under and pursuant to the provisions of Public Law 86-121 (73 Stat. 267), hereinafter called the IHS; and the White Mountain Apache Tribe, hereinafter called the Tribe, acting through the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council; and the White Mountain Apache Tribal Utility Authority, hereinafter called the Utility, entered into a Memorandum of Agreement executed for the IHS on April 16, 1981, for the Tribe on May 13, 1981, and for the Utility on May 5, 1981. Regarding the provision of sanitation facilities on the White Mountain Apache Indian Reservation;

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) through the Arizona Department of Health Service (ADHS), and the Indian Health Service (IHS) in February of 1981 agreed to construct the project in two phases; and

WHEREAS, the IHS was to assist in funding of phase I as determined by EPA, ADHS and IHS; and

WHEREAS, the project provided for in that Agreement and as phased above, has been completed, and

WHEREAS, the parties are desirous of providing for and assuring the proper and efficient maintenance and continued operation of said water supply and waste disposal facilities; and

WHEREAS, under Section 7 (a) (4) of Public Law 86-121, the IHS on behalf of the United States of American is authorized to transfer the completed facilities with or without a money consideration, and under such terms and conditions as are appropriate, having regard to the contributions made and the maintenance responsibility undertaken, and the special health needs of the Indian people.

NOW THEREFORE, in accordance with the terms of said agreement, and pursuant to Section 7 (a) (4) of Public Law 86-121:

1. The IHS hereby transfers, assigns, and conveys to the White Mountain Apache Tribal Utility Authority, through the Tribe, without a money consideration and under the terms and conditions set forth in the aforesaid agreement, all of the right, title and interest of the United States of America in all individual and community facilities and appurtenances thereto constructed, including all materials, supplies, and equipment provided for and incorporated in such facilities. Refer to Attachment A for a list of the items transferred and the appropriate receiving agency.
2. The IHS has assisted the Tribe in startup operations of the system and participated in correction of any defect related to material or workmanship jointly identified by the Tribe and the IHS, for a period of one year from the date of beneficial operation which was April 1, 1983.

3. The White Mountain Apache Tribal Utility Authority, through the Tribe hereby accepts such transfer under the terms and conditions set forth in the aforesaid Memorandum of Agreement and agrees to operate, maintain and repair such facilities as the property of the Utility Authority to keep the facilities in an effective and operating condition.
