

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

COMPLETE  
11 SEP 1986

WHEREAS, Tribal Member Bowman Daley has requested tribal Council assistance in respect to job discrimination charges he has made against the Fort Apache Indian Agency; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Daley advises the Tribal Council that he and two other tribal members were chosen as the top three candidates for heavy equipment operator for the Bureau of Indian Affairs and that he was qualified to be hired for said position, but that instead, the Bureau readvertised the position and selected a non-member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to fill the position; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing Mr. Daley believes that he has been discriminated against by the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council also concludes that there is reason to believe that Mr. Daley and other tribal members competing for the position and other positions with the Fort Apache Indian Agency are being discriminated against in that it appears qualified tribal members are being passed over in favor of non-members and non-Indians for Bureau positions; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that the Civil Service Commission should be contacted in respect to Bowman Daley's case and should be requested to conduct an internal investigation of the hiring practices of the Fort Apache Indian Agency in respect to the hiring of tribal members generally.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the U.S. Civil Service Commission to investigate allegations of unfair treatment and employment discrimination by the Fort Apache Indian Agency against Mr. Bowman Daley and other tribal members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on August 5, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
