## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, tribal member Sandy Williams has come before the Tribal Council and requested that the old Federal Credit Union Building situated behind the Whiteriver Trading Post be transferred to him as his home as he is in need of shelter; and
- WHEREAS, said building is presently unoccupied and is very small in area; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes Mr. Sandy Williams should be given ownership and possession of said tribal building.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby transfers all right and title, interest to the old Credit Union building to Mr. Sandy Williams, a tribal member.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it directs the Tribal business office to transfer to Mr. Sandy Williams all right, title, and interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to the old Federal Credit Union building and advise Mr. Sandy Williams that he shall be responsible for all fire insurance, utilities and maintenance and for said building
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it further grants Mr. Williams request that he be permitted to remove the building from its present location to a homesite area of his choice, the choice of which shall be approved by the Tribal Land Board if necessary.

The foregoing resolution was on August 6, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Conscitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
