RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

11 SEP 1986

- WHEREAS, a program is underway to renovate the Cibecue Fair and Rodeo grounds and reopen it for public use; and
- WHEREAS, a sanitation landfill exists in close proximity to the Cibecue Fair Grounds and has created offensive odors and other potential health hazards to the public; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council requests that the Land Operations Division of the Bureau of Indian Affairs push the sanitation landfill back away from the Cibecue Rodeo grounds for the protection of the public.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests Superintendent Russell Bradley and Mike Smith, Chief of Bureau Land Operations to direct that the sanitation landfill be pushed back and away from the Cibecue Rodeo grounds in such a way as to eliminate public exposure to odors and other hazards from the landfill area.

The foregoing resolution was on August 8, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
