

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Family Violence Awareness Week will be observed throughout the United States and the State of Arizona during the week of October 6-12, 1986: and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this observance is to educate the community about alternatives to family violence; and

WHEREAS, family violence--the physical beating of spouses and children--is one of the major concern's of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and

WHEREAS, educating community members about family violence and treatment issues will contribute to family unity and well-being; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to recognize and support the efforts made by the Committee for Family Peace in understanding and treating family violence.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby proclaims the week of October 6-12, 1986, as "Let's Join Hands to Stop Family Abuse" week; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council encourages all tribal members and other concerned community members to support and participate in the scheduled events in the hopes of reducing and eventually alleviating incidences of domestic violence, especially those offenses committed against spouses and children.

The foregoing resolution was on September 10, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
