

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the recent destruction by fire of the East Fork Mission School has created an emergency situation for students attending said school; and

WHEREAS, over crowding at other public schools precludes the East Fork Mission students being transferred temporarily to said schools; and

WHEREAS, the Theodore Roosevelt Boarding School has ample space to accommodate the East Fork Mission students for the remainder of the school year or until such time as the East Fork Mission School is rebuilt; and


WHEREAS, the Theodore Roosevelt School Board is agreeable to accepting the East Fork Mission students, the majority of whom are tribal members, for the remainder of the school year due to the emergency situation existing; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council hereby formally requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs allow the children formerly attending the East Fork Mission School to utilize the Theodore Roosevelt School for the remainder of the school year or until such time East Fork Mission school is rebuilt for suitable use.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs to grant permission to the East Fork Mission students to utilize the Theodore Roosevelt School for the remainder of the school year and that the teachers and staff of the East Fork Mission be permitted to conduct their classes in the available class space at the Theodore Roosevelt School.

The foregoing resolution was on November 5, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of eleven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h), (a)

of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
