RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that there is a great need to apply gravel to roads leading to the new HUD homes constructed pursuant to HUD Projects AZ 16-30 and AZ 16-31, as the present road conditions are poor and deteriorate during inclement weather conditions; and


WHEREAS, the application of gravel would alleviate the muddy conditions of the roads leading to these homes and would allow for safe and passable vehicular travel; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Bureau of Indian Affairs should apply the gravel and include said project as part of the Bureau of Indian Affairs road system.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs include the graveling of roads leading to homes constructed as part of AZ 16-30 and AZ 16-31 as part of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Priority Road System List.

The foregoing resolution was on November 5, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h), (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
