
RESOLUTION NO. 86-376


FORT APACHE INDIAN AGENCY WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
WHITERIVER, ARIZ. FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is dedicated to improving and upgrading the economic functioning of all its members; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Vocational Skill Center is the tribal entity charged with providing both GED/Basic Skills, Family-Life Coping skills and with improving and upgrading the employability and employment skills of said members; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Vocational Skill Center recognizes the specific needs of Tribal members who are young women, pregnant and/or parents and have either dropped out of high school, Jr. high school or elementary school and who have no employable skills; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Vocational Skill Center recognizes the specific needs of said tribal members who are predisposed to and who are high risk to committing child neglect and abuse; and
- WHEREAS, there is currently funding available for providing and coordinating efforts between Indian Health Services, the Tribal Guidance Center, Women/Infants and Children, Tribal Social Services and the Vocational Skill Center to said members for Family-Life Training, GED/Basic Skills, Vocational Training, Parenting and Outreach from the Office of Human Development, United States Department of Health and Human Services; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe Vocational Skill Center has identified the need for such services and the Tribal Council supports the Vocational Skill Center in coordinating and providing such services to said members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal council may authorize the Tribal Chairman to negotiate and execute grants, contracts and amendments thereto.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes the Vocational Skill Center to submit a proposal to the Office of Human Development of the United States Department of Health and Human Services, to provide and coordinate effort for Family Life Training, GED/Basic Skills, Vocational Training, Parenting and Outreach to teenage tribal parents.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that, if funded, the Vocational Skill Center shall be the authorized Tribal agency to administer the training of the program: MODELS TO ASSIST TEENAGE PARENTS IN PREVENTING CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT.

RESOLUTION NO. 86-376

The foregoing resolution was on DECEMBER 4, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT FOR AND ZERO AGAINST by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
