



RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that several employees have lodged grievances in respect to the Personnel Policies of Apache Enterprise; and
- WHEREAS, in summary, these complaints are based upon alleged, unfair treatment in terms of termination from that enterprise; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council also is advised that there are other management problems pertaining to the Hondah Store and Service Station, the Whiteriver Liquor Store, and certain named management staff; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the matters indicate problems within the enterprise which should be investigated; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further concludes that Council Member Herbert Tate should coordinate with Apache Labor Relations Director, Ramon Riley, and conduct a thorough investigation of employee grievances and management problems of the enterprise.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Council Member Herbert Tate and Apache Labor Relations Director, Ramon Riley, to conduct a thorough investigation of employee grievances and allegations of management problems of Apache Enterprise and report back to the Tribal Council after said investigation is completed.

The foregoing resolution was on December 4, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
