RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been provided a report from the Tribal Chairman's Office of the outstanding accounts receivables of the various Enterprises as of October 31, 1986, a copy of which is attached to this resolution and incorporated by reference herein; and
- WHEREAS, substantial amounts of the account receivables are overdue in excess of ninety days, which fact is the cause of great concern on the part of the Tribal Chairman and Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that each and every Enterprise Manager should immediately initiate aggressive collection procedures to reduce these accounts receivables so that they remain current; and
- WHEREAS, the Office of the Tribal Chairman is agreeable to act as monitor of the progress of the Enterprises in that regard.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs each and every Enterprise Manager to aggressively pursue collection of its delinquent accounts receivables and to forthwith bring all accounts receivables current.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby request the Tribal Chairman's Office to monitor the collection efforts of the various Enterprise Manager and to report back to the Council as to the progress being made to reduce the outstanding accounts receivables.

The foregoing resolution was on December 5, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of $\frac{7}{}$ for $\frac{1}{}$ and $\frac{0}{}$ against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe,

pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
