RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been requested by tribal members Abel Burnette and Devore Thompson, members of the local American Legion Post #60, for financial assistance to initiate necessary repairs for the American Legion Building which is owned by the White Mountain Apache Tribe as a tribal government building; and
- WHEREAS, the Council is advised that the building allowed by the Tribe to be used by the American Legion Post is in dire need of repairs and may soon be rendered uninhabitable unless assistance is forthcoming; and
- WHEREAS, it is recommended that Revenue Sharing funds in the amount of \$5,000 be utilized to initiate repairs for the building.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes after compliance with applicable federal Revenue Sharing regulations, the sum of \$5,000 to initiate necessary repairs on the tribal building presently being utilized by the American Legion Post #60.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Mr. Devore Thompson to be responsible for complying with applicable Revenue Sharing regulations pertaining to notices of public hearings and that he confer with the Tribal Controller for further information pertaining to compliance with Federal Revenue Sharing regulations.

The foregoing resolution was on January 7, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of ELEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i,j,k) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
