## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Divorce and family dissolution is a problem of concern throughout the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and effects each and every family member wherever it exists; and
- WHEREAS, Family unity and preservation of traditional family life is one of the Tribal Council's major concerns; and
- WHEREAS, The White Mountain Apache Tribe is eligible for a funding grant under the Indian Child Welfare Act.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the efforts of the Tribal Social Services and the Tribal Guidance Center to provide services to families at risk of divorce and family break-up under a grant through the Indian Child Welfare Act.

The foregoing resolution was on JANUARY 9, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a, b, g, j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
