## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware of a grave housing shortage in the Cibecue area; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that a housing plan based upon the needs of the Cibecue Community for Mutual-Help Housing should be developed as soon as possible; and
- WHEREAS, plans for housing projects for the Cibecue area should be developed through the efforts of the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority and the Office of the Tribal Chairman.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
  Tribe that it hereby requests that the White Mountain Apache
  Housing Authority Director cooperate and assist the Office
  of the Tribal Chairman to develop a housing plan for the
  Cibecue community.

The foregoing resolution was on February 24, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of <u>ELEVEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
