RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Reverend Arthur Guenther of the Lutheran Church requests that the Cibecue Lutheran Mission, otherwise known as the Lower Cibecue Church Site, be designated as a historical site as it was constructed by Apache people in 1911; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees that the church should be maintained as a tribal historical landmark under the maintenance and care of the Lutheran Church; and
- WHEREAS, Reverend Guenther is requesting that the Cibecue Lutheran Mission revocable permit be extended for a period of ten years, and the Tribal Council concurs with said request.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the designation of the Cibecue Lutheran Mission as a tribal historic landmark to be maintained by the Lutheran Church.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby approves a ten year revocable permit for the Cibecue Lutheran Mission.

The foregoing resolution was on April 1, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
