## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that the Tribal Education Department, Cibecue Administration Office, Tribal Program Director, and the Apache Labor Relations Office, formerly know as the TERO Office, are in need of safe vehicles to replace vehicles presently being used by these departments, and a new tractor is needed for the Farm Coop. Program in Cibecue; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised by the Tribal Controller that Federal Revenue Sharing Funds may be available for the purchase of four new tribal vehicles for the foregoing programs, and a new tractor for the Farm Coop Operations in Cibecue; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after being advised of the condition of the four vehicles and need for a new tractor, concludes that for safety and reasons of economy, these new vehicles should be purchased for Tribal Education, Cibecue Administration, Director of Tribal Programs and the Apache Labor Relations Office.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the expenditure of Federal Revenue Sharing Funds for the purchase of four new tribal vehicles and a new tractor for the Tribal Education Department, Cibecue Administration, Tribal Program Director, Apache Labor Relations Office, and Cibecue Farm Coop Program, respectively.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the written permission of the Tribal Chairman must be obtained prior to the ordering or purchase of any of the foregoing tribal vehicles, and that three bids must be obtained for each vehicle to be purchased prior to being submitted to the Tribal Chairman and Comptroller for approval.

The foregoing resolution was on April 21, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of <u>TEN</u> for and <u>ONE</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
