## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, tribal member, Lindsay Kasey, has come before the Tribal Council asking for assistance in repairing his home which was recently damaged by lightning; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that Mr. Kasey's home is beyond repair and that an investment of funds into the house at this time would be pointless; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that Mr. Kasey has applied to the White Mountain Apache Tribal Housing Authority for housing in the Ben-Gay Project and has been told by the Housing Authority that rent for one of these homes is approximately \$218 per month; and
- Mr. Kasey is presently employed by the L.A.M.P. WHEREAS, Program and is earning minimum wages and said rent quotation by the Housing Authority seems somewhat inflated.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby request the Executive Director of the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority to make every attempt to find Mr. Kasey suitable housing within the Ben-Gay Housing Project and at a reasonable rental price and to report to the Tribal Council as to why Mr. Kasey, a L.A.M.P. worker is to be charged \$218 per month for rent.

The foregoing resolution was on May 6, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
