WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that the Theodore Roosevelt School has a siren which is not in use and


WHEREAS, the Cibecue Day School is in need of a siren; and


WHEREAS, it is suggested that the Theodore Roosevelt School siren be transferred to the Cibecue Day School for use by the day school; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that Council Member Darvin Burnette should request on behalf of the Tribal Council that the Bureau of Indian Affairs transfer the Theodore Roosevelt School siren to the Cibecue Day School and that Mr. Burnette pursue said request through appropriate channels in the Bureau of Indian Affairs and through the Theodore Roosevelt School Board.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby request and authorizes Tribal Council Member, Mr. Darvin Burnette, to request the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Theodore Roosevelt School Board to grant permission to transfer the Theodore Roosevelt siren to the Cibecue Day School.

The foregoing resolution was on May 13, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
