RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is a federally recognized tribe organized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, 25 U.S.C. §476; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is mandated within its Constitution and Bylaws to promote the safety and well being of its tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the immediate need to clean up its community and to supply needed sanitary facilities and landfills for the well being of its tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that there is currently available from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, certain Imminent Threat funds which can be utilized to alleviate the sanitary landfill problems here on the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that Mr. Darvin Burnette, Mr. Devore Thompson, Mr. Dallas Massey, the Tribal Engineer, and the Tribal Planner should be directed to pursue and secure the available Imminent Threat funding from HUD in the amount necessary to alleviate the local landfill problems.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Mr. Darvin Burnette, Mr. Devore Thompson, Mr. Dallas Massey, the Tribal Engineer and the Tribal Planner to pursue and secure available Imminent Threat funding from HUD in the amount necessary to alleviate the local landfill problems.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby approves as a temporary landfill site the following area: the land area between the hills one-half mile southwest of the Tribal Utility Storage Yard, said area having a total dimension of 1000 ft. long and 600 ft. wide.

The foregoing resolution was on May 20, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 2 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
