## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Indian Agency of the Bureau of Indian Affairs has presented to the Tribal Council its proposed budget for FY 88/89 regarding banded and unbanded monies; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after considerable discussion, and explanation from Bureau personnel representing the various departments funded by banded and unbanded monies concludes that approval of the proposed B.I.A. budget should be at a 110% funding level for FY 88/89; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council urges Congress to appropriate monies to the Fort Apache Indian Agency at that level for vital services to the White Mountain Apache Tribe and to fulfill trustee obligations of the United States of America to the tribal people; and
- WHEREAS, in the event that the B.I.A. is funded at the 110% level for FY 88/89 the Tribal Council concludes that the additional ten (10%) should be allocated as follows: (1) Education \$200,000; (2) Adult Education \$25,000; (3) Community Fire Protection \$100,000; (4) Wildlife Protection \$52,000; (5) Law and Order \$100,000;
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the proposed B.I.A. Fort Apache Indian Agency Budget for FY 88/89 at the 110% funding level.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that in the event that the Fort Apache Indian Agency is approved at the 110% funding level, the additional 10% allocation shall be distributed as follows: 1) Education \$200,000; 2) Adult Education \$25,000; 3) Community Fire Protection \$100,000; 4) Wildlife \$52,000; 5) Law and Order \$100,000.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby requests that Congress approve funding at the 110% level in order to assist the White Mountain Apache Tribe in its ongoing efforts to achieve economic and governmental self sufficiency.
- The foregoing resolution was on May 27, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of  $\underbrace{\text{NINE}}_{}$  for and  $\underbrace{\text{ONE}}_{}$  against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested

in it by Article V, Section 1 (i), (j), and (c) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
