

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Fort Apache Agency, Branch of Roads has requested a right-of-way for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a new bridge across Chino Springs; and

WHEREAS, said proposed right-of-way is designated as Bureau of Indian Affairs project FAIR Consolidated Number 15; and

WHEREAS, the requested right-of-way is on Route 70, which serves as an access route to the Tribe's timber country, which provides vital income to the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the proposed right-of-way is 0.727 mile in length, 100 feet in width and comprised of 8.806 acres more or less, as depicted in drawing number FA-70-3 attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the new bridge site will be safer with improved alignment and grade, and will accommodate higher gross weights.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants the request of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Fort Apache Agency, Branch of Roads, for a right-of-way to construct and maintain a new bridge across Chino Springs on Route 70 as detailed in drawing number FA-70-3 attached hereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the purposes for granting this right-of-way are stated above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Chairman or his designee is hereby authorized to sign the necessary documents for the right-of-way

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of ELEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f)&(g) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
