RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Diane Lenz, has requested Tribal Council support for a grant application to the State of Arizona for expanded services in the area of special education for handicapped children; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is extremely appreciative of the work that Ms. Lenz and Northern Arizona University has initiated and accomplished in the area of providing services, training, and research for the remediation of human disabilities; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council unanimously supports the application being made to the State of Arizona to expand services for handicapped children and early intervention for infants and their families.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that it hereby supports the efforts of Diane Lenz and Northern Arizona University to apply for grant monies to expand services for handicapped infants and children.

The foregoing resolution was on JULY 9, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of NINE FOR AND ONE AGAINST by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
