## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes its most precious resources is the youth of the Fort Apache Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Youth Group Home is presently an extension of Tribal Social Services and should be separated from Social Services due to plans for future expansion; and
- WHEREAS, the Youth Group Home recognizes the need for expanded facilities at the Youth Group Home to include youths with severe behavioral problems and an emergency nursery.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby separates the Youth Group Home from Tribal Social Services and to expand its facilities to operate a second Youth Group Home for youths with severe behavioral problems including an emergency nursery.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>JULY 9, 1987</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>NINE FOR AND ZERO AGAINST</u> by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
