## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware of the annual problem created by large numbers of grasshoppers infesting the reservation and destroying crops and other vegetation to the detriment of tribal members and the reservation as a whole; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to address this problem and to seek whatever means are necessary and available to alleviate the problem; and
- WHEREAS, the local county governments have sought the support of the Tribe and elected officials of the county have been well supported by the reservation communities, and the Council is of the opinion that these local counties may be able to provide certain services in the alleviation of the grasshopper infestation problem, in particular, it may be possible to secure aid from the county extension services of those counties which lay within the borders of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby solicits the support of the counties located within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in alleviating the grasshopper problem which annually inflicts severe damage upon the reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby directs that Mr. Don Booker, the Tribal Planner, and John Caid of the Game & Fish Department, to meet with officials of the local county governments and the county extension services to determine whether or not the counties may be of some service to the Tribe in addressing the grasshopper infestation problem. Mr. Booker and Mr. Caid should report their findings to the Tribal Council at the next regularly scheduled Tribal Council meeting.

The foregoing resolution was on August 7, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of <u>ELEVEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(a),(f) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
