

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Police Department is the law enforcement agency responsible for law enforcement within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and


WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Police Department has proposed entering into a cooperative intergovernmental agreement with the Navajo County Sheriff's Department, the Apache County Sheriff's Department, the Holbrook Police Department, the Pinetop-Lakeside Police Department, the Show Low Police Department, and the Eagar Police Department, for the establishment of a 911 emergency system for the promotion of emergency assistance within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona has agreed to provide the funds for the purchase, installation and maintenance of the equipment necessary for the operation of the 911 emergency system and the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police Department has agreed to provide answering personnel at their expense to receive calls for assistance within the jurisdiction of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs with the proposal of the White Mountain Apache Police Department that a 911 emergency system should be established on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Police Department is hereby authorized to enter into an intergovernmental agreement, a copy of which is attached to this resolution, for the purpose of establishing, operating, and maintaining a 911 emergency system on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and the Tribal Chairman is authorized to sign said intergovernmental agreement on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on December 2, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and FOUR against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
