RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Sunrise Ski Resort continues to be a key component in the overall economic development plan of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Tribal Council anticipates that additional expansion and development of the Sunrise Ski resort will be necessitated in the future; and
- WHEREAS, Navopache Electric Cooperative supplies all electricity necessary to operate the Sunrise Resort and Navopache has requested from the Tribal Council a statement affirming the Tribe's plans to continue the expansion and development of Sunrise in the future, said statement to be used by Navopache as partial justification of its long range plans for making available additional electricity to Sunrise, including the construction of new or larger lines as needed; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Councils concurs in the request of Navopache and supports Navopache's long range planning efforts which will make the future development of Sunrise more efficient and effective.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby affirms its commitment to pursue future expansion and development of the Sunrise Ski Resort for the benefit of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on December 2, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and FOUR against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) & (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
