RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised by the Acting B.I.A. Superintendent that one of the local B.I.A. Law Enforcement Investigators is being transferred to the Truxton Agency; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is acutely aware of the shortage of law enforcement personnel on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and is opposed to any reduction in force resulting from a BIA internal transfer of personnel; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to maintain the maximum degree of police protection and criminal investigative activity on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and in particular desires that the BIA assign a full time investigator to serve the Cibecue Community.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it does hereby enter its protest of the transfer of the local BIA Law Enforcement Investigator from Phiteriver to the Truxton Agency and does request that a full time BIA Law Enforcement Investigator be assigned to the Cibecue Community to assist the Phite Mountain Apache Police Department in its law enforcement efforts.

The foregoing resolution was on December 7, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of ELEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
