

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Tribal Councilmember, Ray Ivans, and Tribal Administrative Manager, Devore Thompson, have presented to the Tribal Council a proposal to establish a woodcutting project for the benefit of the members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, which project would involve central purchasing of firewood cut by tribal members, for resale for the benefit of needy tribal members and at wakes; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that such a woodcutting project would aid the Tribal Council in regulating the amounts and kinds of wood taken from the reservation for firewood purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that the project would be a benefit to those tribal members who are otherwise unable to obtain adequate sources of firewood or who during times of bereavement are unable to do so.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Councilmember Ray Ivans and Tribal Administrative Manager Devore Thompson are hereby directed to prepare a full proposal for the establishment of a woodcutting project including a budget for fiscal year 1988/89 for the capital start up and operation of the project, and to report to the Tribal Council at their earliest convenience concerning progress on this project.

The foregoing resolution was on January 7, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
