## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- the building housing the Land Operations Department of WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs was recently totally destroyed by fire; and
- the Land Operations activities relate directly to the WHEREAS, protection and management of the natural resources of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, which natural resources are of critical importance to the tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council desires that the Land Operations activities be continued with as little interruption as possible.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council hereby directs that efforts be undertaken to aggressively seek and identify funding sources to construct a new building to house the Land Operations Department, said building to be constructed on a site in the industrial park; and further directs that these undertaken be in cooperation appropriate officials of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The foregoing resolution was on January 7, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of  $\overline{\text{EIGHT}}$  for and  $\overline{\text{ZERO}}$  against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache  $\overline{\text{Tribe}}$ , pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a), (f), (h) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
