

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Tribal members Lonnie Dehose, Verlie Caddo, and Manuelita Early have advised the Tribal Council that they have experienced problems during the winter months in reaching their homes over the sometimes inaccessible access road which service their homes due to poor construction, maintenance and wet weather; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that surplus gravel exists at rock crushing sites currently occupied or occupied in the past by Development Enterprise; and

WHEREAS, this surplus and otherwise unusable gravel can be made available to these homes and individuals for use on their driveways and access roads; and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has agreed to cooperate with the Tribe in making delivery and placing this surplus material on these access roads and driveways for the benefit of these tribal members at Cibecue.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby commits an adequate supply of surplus gravel to be utilized in upgrading the access roads and driveways of the aforementioned tribal members and the same shall be done with the assistance of the Bureau of Indian Affairs which will assist with transportation and application of the material.


The foregoing resolution was on January 7, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
