RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Economic Development Committee has proposed to the Tribal Council that the tribe construct a commercial complex in the community of Cibecue in order to serve the needs of that community; and
- WHEREAS, the people of Cibecue have long been faced with the prospect of high prices created by the monopoly enjoyed by the non-Indian traders owning businesses in Cibecue; and
- WHEREAS, it is in the best interset of the people of Cibecue that adequate shopping facilities and recreation facilities be provided which will offer an alternative and a opportunity for cost savings and the proposed Cibecue Commercial Complex offers such advantages and benefit; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed the proposal and the plans concerning the Cibecue Complex and is of the opinion that construction of such complex by the tribe is in the best interest of the people of the tribe and particularly the people of the Cibecue Community.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the proposed plan to construct the Cibecue Commercial Complex in the community of Cibecue and hereby gives its authorization to commence with construction of the project as soon as funding is made available; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council directs the Tribal Chairman and the Economic Development Committee to secure adequate financing and funding to complete construction of the commercial complex in as quickly and efficiently as possible.

The foregoing resolution was on January 20, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and
