## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it has become abundantly clear that the White Mountain Apache Tribe, Whiteriver, needs to immediately begin the further development of its vast touristic resources; and
- WHEREAS, of first importance in this respect, the Tribal Government has the most pressing need for a meaningful Master Plan that will pinpoint those areas of potential development most deserving of further consideration; and
- WHEREAS, with the extremely high unemployment rate on the Reservation, the Tribe has need of many new jobs as quickly as they can be created; and
- WHEREAS, a Master Plan is the logical first step in further tourism development;
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council authorizes its Planning Staff to apply for funding from the Administration for Native Americans, which funding will permit the accomplishment of this needed plan.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED if for any reason information may be lacking to make the application complete for the forthcoming February submission date, the Tribal Council would then want the staff to re-apply to meet the May deadline.

The foregoing resolution was on January 20, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
