- WHEREAS, the Tribal Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe calls for regular elections to be held for the election of council members; and
- WHEREAS, there are four seat which will be up for election in April of 1988 and the tribal election law calls for a primary election to be held in order to determine the candidates whose names will appear on the general election ballot in April; and
- WHEREAS, a primary election was held by the tribe on Wednesday, February 3, 1988, for District II, Carrizo, Forestdale and Cedar Creek, wherein three candidates submitted their names to a vote of the people in order to determine which two of the three will appear on the general election ballot in April; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Election Commission has certified to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the primary election is complete and has been carried out in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 3 of the Government Code of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and has certified that of a total district vote of 382 votes, the following number of votes were received by the following individuals:

and have certified that the two candidates receiving the first highest and second highest votes have qualified to have their names appear on the General Election Ballot in April and those individuals are Lafe Altaha and Reagan Armstrong, Sr. and a copy of the Election Commission certification is attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the Election Commission further informs the Tribal Council that it was not necessary to have a primary election in Districts I, III, and IV due to the fact that only two candidates from each of the districts submitted nomination petitions for the election and therefore after having qualified pursuant to the nominated petition procedure are eligible to have their names appear on the ballot of the General Election in April; and

WHEREAS, the Election Commission informs the Tribal Council that the following individuals have qualified by submitting the required nominating petitions to the Tribal Council Secretary and are eligible as candidates in the 1988 General Election

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the certification of election results submitted by the Tribal Election Commission for District II, Carrizo, Cedar Creek and Forestdale is hereby accepted and the attached certification of election results incorporated into this resolution.
