

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has for many years been funded by the Economic Development Administration (EDA) in support of the development, maintenance, and update of the Tribal Overall Economic Development Program (OEDP); said annual funding of \$30,000 having contributed significantly to the planning, coordination and development of important economic projects on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, the annual renewal of the EDA Planning Grant funding requires Tribal Council approval; and

WHEREAS, for the coming year, despite certain overall shortages in administrative funding throughout the EDA, the Regional Office, pleased with the local programs efforts and achievements, has increased the grant to \$35,000.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the continuation of the Tribal OEDP process and authorizes the application for funding in an amount up to \$35,000 for FY 1988.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman be authorized to take such actions as are required to assure continuation of EDA economic planning assistance to the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on February 10, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of ELEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
