


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, Divorce and Family dissolution is a problem of concern throughout the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and affects each and every family member wherever it exists; and
- WHEREAS, family unit and preservation of traditional family life is one of the Tribal Council's major concerns; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is currently funded for the Families-at-Risk Program under the Indian Child Welfare Act; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe supports the Families-at-Risk Program and wishes to continue this program.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the efforts of the Tribal Social Services and the Tribal Guidance Center to provide services to families at risk of divorce and family break-up under a grant through the Indian Child Welfare Act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves and authorizes the Tribal Chairman, or his authorized delegate acting on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, to enter into a contract or negotiations with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for Indian Child Welfare Act funding.

The foregoing resolution was on February 19, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i), (j), of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
