


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Councilmember Kino Kane has come before the Tribal Council on behalf of the Northern Arizona University Institute for Human Development (IHD), which is a federally funded program working with newborn infants who are "at risk" for later developmental disabilities due to problems at birth, asphyxia, etc.; and
- WHEREAS, said newborn infants may be able to develop normally, especially if they receive medical help at an early stage; and
- WHEREAS, the IHD program is funded by a grant from the Handicapped Children's Early Education Program (HCEEP), through the U.S. Department of Education, and is presently sharing a classroom with the PUSH Program at the Alchessay Hall two days a week; and
- WHEREAS, due to the increased number of local infants who are at risk, the IHD Program is requesting assistance in locating office space for their exclusive use for staff training, meetings, parent group meetings, etc.; and
- WHEREAS, Councilman Kino Kane has advised the Tribal Council of the importance of the program and has further requested the use of office space at the old PHS Hospital, which space was formerly used by the Bilingual Program, for the IHD program; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the benefits of such a program on the reservation and the importance of its operation and suggests a small rental fee be approved.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the request for office space at the old PHS Hospital for the exclusive use of the Institute for Human Development, and that a small rental fee of \$50.00 is also approved.

The foregoing resolution was on March 10, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(a),(h) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
