RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, approximately one year ago a safe with money belonging to Headstart and the junior rodeo was stolen; and
- WHEREAS, the amounts involved give the BIA Law Enforcement Agency jurisdiction in the matter and they have undertaken an investigation; and
- the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is very WHEREAS, concerned that the matter be appropriately resolved and no resolution of the matter has come to their attention.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it requests that the BIA Agency Law Enforcement Office advise the Tribal Council of the Disposition of this matter.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council requests that if no further action is to be taken by local BIA officials that the matter be referred to the FBI.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this request be addressed within ten (10) days of the effective date of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on March 10, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
