
RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has proposed to the Tribal Council that the abandoned roadway, being two (2) miles in length, on Route 12 terminating at Oak Creek Rand Road, be deleted from the BIA Federal-Aid Indian Road System and the currently used roadway, being two (2) miles in length, on Route 12 ending at Oak Creek Ranch Road cut-off, be added to the BIA Federal-Aid Indian Road System; and

WHEREAS, the proposed added road was constructed by Tribal Forces and has been used for over 15 years and will be constructed to BIA Standards.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby adds to the system the currently used roadway and deletes the abandoned roadway from the system.

The foregoing resolution was on March 10, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for, ZERO against and 1 abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
