

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs rebuild Route 12, road to Oak Creek Ranch; and


WHEREAS, the Tribe wishes to consent to a gratuitous right-of-way 200 feet in width, beginning 4158.78 feet southwest from Cibecue Creek, a total distance of 11.74 miles; and

WHEREAS, the resolution supercedes Resolution No. 78-205 as delineated on DWG #FA.-12-4 dated 11-27-78.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous right-of-way as recorded on a map on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona, to which reference is hereby made.

The foregoing resolution was on March 10, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for, ZERO against and 1 abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
