## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it is the policy of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to provide safe and adequately maintained public roads; and
- WHEREAS, the ultimate responsibility for the administration and maintenance of reservation roads rests with the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the local housing authority is a public body and the property of the local housing authority is declared to be publicly used for essential public and governmental purposes; and
- WHEREAS, it is a condition subsequent for federal approval of the Program Reservation application for Project No. AZ 16-43 and AZ 16-44.
- THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe as follows:
  - 1. Upon dedication by the local housing authority of roads contained within completed housing projects funded under the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, the White Mountain Apache Tribe accepts the said project streets into the local street and highway system; and
  - 2. By this resolution the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs add the streets and roads referenced herein to the Federal Aid Indian Road System for maintenance pursuant to 25 C.F.R. §170.6.

The foregoing resolution was on April 27, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
