

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, by Tribal Council Resolution No. 84-14 the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe prohibited the Bureau of Indian Affairs from fencing related to the Bonito Prairie Road Project; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been informed by Phillip R. Stago, Jr., Director of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Game & Fish Department that satisfactory arrangements for appropriate fencing to occur have been agreed upon between his department and the BIA; and


WHEREAS, the fencing arrangements appear to take into account the previous concerns related to wildlife movements.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Resolution No. 84-14 is partially rescinded, this rescission only affects that portion of Resolution No. 84-14 prohibiting fencing, all other parts of Resolution No. 84-14 remain in full force and effect, provided the fencing takes into account and is not detrimental to necessary wildlife movements.

The foregoing resolution was on April 29, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
