RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, having been duly advised by Justice Commissioner Vincent Craig that the Tribal Police Department has received a grant for a specialized "D.W.I. ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM" through the Indian Highway Safety Grant in the amount of \$36,065; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes and understands the need to greatly curb or eradicate reservation drunk driving for the purpose of sending a visible and viable message to the public regarding the hazards of drunk driving; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council strongly adheres to and supports the public safety policy of promoting programs which involve the prevention of alcohol abuse by any department or entity of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police Department to negotiate and finalize all aspects of the "C.Y. 1987 INDIAN HIGHWAY SAFETY GRANT FOR THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE", and does hereby accept grant funds on behalf of the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on May 12, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of <u>ELEVEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
