RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mr. Benny Lupe, a former employee of the Fort Apache Timber Company, has come before the Tribal Council and has been afforded his final level of appeal pursuant to the Tribe's Grievance Procedure and arising out of Mr. Lupe's grievance filed against the Fort Apache Timber Company alleging that he was wrongfully terminated from employment; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has considered the evidence and reviewed the record, and heard the arguments presented by Mr. Lupe, and has considered the evidence presented by FATCO and heard the arguments; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion and finds that Mr. Lupe was not wrongfully terminated from FATCO.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby affirms the decision of the FATCO Grievance Committee, to the effect that Mr. Lupe was not wrongfully terminated from employment at the Fort Apache Timber Company.

The foregoing resolution was on March 22, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of <u>SEVEN</u> for and <u>ONE</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
