

RESOLUTION OF THE  
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, The Tribal Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe requires that regular elections be held for the election of council members; and

WHEREAS, there are four council seats which are up for election in the April 1988 tribal general election; and

WHEREAS, a general election was held by the tribe on Wednesday, April 6, 1988, for District I, Cibecue, District II, Carrizo, Forestdale and Cedar Creek, District III, East Fork, Seven Mile, and District IV, Whiteriver, Canyon Day, and North Fork wherein the candidates submitted their names to a vote of the people in order to determine the council member to be elected for each of these districts; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Election Commission has certified to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the general election is complete and has been carried out in accordance with the provisions of Article VIII of the Constitution and Bylaws of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and Chapter 3 of the Government Code of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and has certified that:

I. Of a total District I vote of 730 votes, the following number of votes were received by the following individuals:

II. Of a total District II vote of 515 votes, the following number of votes were received by the following individuals:

III. Of a total District III vote of 735 votes, the following number of votes were received by the following individuals:

IV. Of a total District IV vote of 1,189 votes, the following number of votes were received by the following individuals:

WHEREAS, the Election Commission informs the Tribal Council that the following individuals have received the highest number of votes from registered voters in the districts in which they are eligible to be elected to a council seat and are therefore eligible to be declared the winner of their respective council seat race:

WHEREAS, the Tribal Election Commission has indicated that these above referenced individuals should be certified by the Tribal Council as elected to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in the 1988 Tribal General Election; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs with the certification presented by the Tribal Election Commission and is of the opinion that the certification should be affirmed and accepted by the Tribal Council.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the certification of election results submitted by the Tribal Election Commission for District I, Cibecue, District II, Cedar Creek, Carrizo, Forestdale; District III, East Fork,

Seven-Mile; and District IV, Whiteriver, Canyon Day, and McNary is hereby accepted and the attached certification of election results is incorporated into this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following individuals are declared to be the winning candidates in the 1988 General Election of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and shall take their seat on the Tribal Council on the first Wednesday of May 1988:

The foregoing resolution was on April 7, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VIII, of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, and Chapter 3 of the government code of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

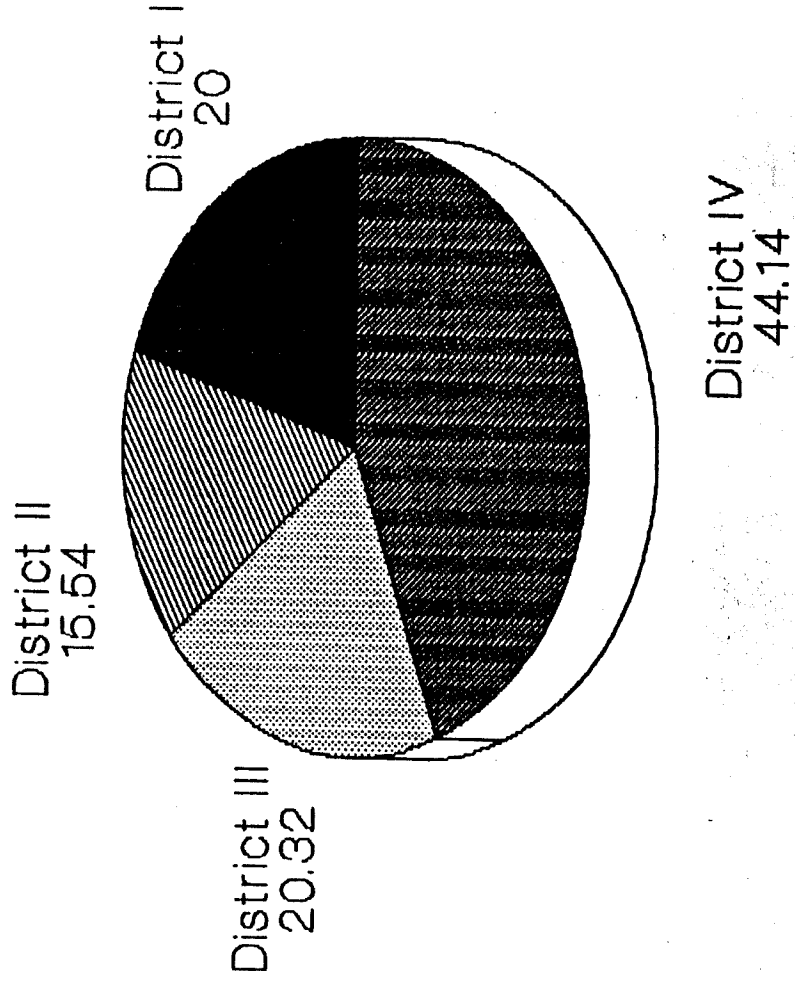
