## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, An interest has been expressed by an off-reservation business for the purchase and removal of two million board feet of aspen timber within two years from the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the annual allowable cut of aspen on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is five million board feet; and
- WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Timber Company is not able to utilize the aspen timber; and
- WHEREAS, utilization of the aspen timber will provide an additional source of stumpage income and logging employment for the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Forestry Committee has approved this proposal.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is directed to prepare, appraise, advertise, sell and administer an aspen timber sale of two million board feet, net log scale, for purchase and harvest within two years following purchase by off-reservation parties; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Forester's concurrence and involvement be obtained in every phase of the sale; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Cone Darnell and anyone acting as his agent be denied the opportunity to bid upon or purchase any aspen or other timber on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation due to his prior vilations of a tribal timber contract.

The foregoing resolution was on April 13, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of <u>SIX</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
